

Thomas Family Scholarship for Study-Abroad

Thanks to the generosity of the Thomas Family, the Department of Political Science annually awards two scholarships, each valued at \$2,500, to political science majors who will study abroad. These scholarships are based primarily on demonstrated financial need. Students may participate in any study abroad program approved by the University. The study abroad experience can be for either the fall of 2009, spring of 2010 or summer of 2010. This includes the study tour to Rome for 2010 (POL 1041 Democracy and Legal Theory) or any other study tour program. An application form is below. Applications should be returned to the Political Science Office no later than August 15th, 2009 for the Fall 2009 semester or September 8th for the Spring 2010 semester.

Study Abroad/Study Tour Scholarship

The Thomas family has established a fund to assist political science students who wish to study abroad or participate in a political science study tour, *i.e.*, POL 2041 Legal theory and Democracy, July 2010, Rome. There are two such scholarships, each carrying a value of twenty-five hundred dollars. To be eligible a student must be shown to have financial need, as determined by the Office of Financial Assistance. Students receiving this scholarship must remit to the Center for International programs the required deposit money within two weeks of being notified of the award. Failure to do so will result in the award being withdrawn.
