NANCY RUTH FOX, PhD

Since joining the faculty of Saint Joseph's University as a member of the Department of Economics in 1986, Nancy Ruth Fox, PhD, professor of economics, has been committed to academic excellence. She is a master teacher and advisor — serving as a model for junior faculty of the importance of caring for students inside and outside of the classroom.

Known for her commitment to engagement in the classroom, Fox strives to make her students excited about economics and provide them with the skills to think like an economist throughout their lives. In addition to teaching core courses in economics, Fox has taught in the Honors program, the Freshman Seminar program and the Service-Learning program. She is well known for her innovative teaching methods and creating courses that are rigorous, interesting and timely. As a former student writes, "Dr. Fox is the epitome of what it means to be a Jesuit educator. Her classes are thought provoking, dynamic, intriguing and most of all, incredibly needed. She loves her students deeply and this is shown through her respect and acceptance of the needs of all. Truly a star."

During her time at Saint Joseph's, Fox has served in a variety of capacities including as an associate dean in the College of Arts and Sciences and as the academic director of the Faith-Justice Institute. In these positions, she spearheaded programs that exemplify her commitment to the principles of Jesuit education. She was the driving force behind SJU Reads, a program for matriculating first-year students. She was also responsible for implementing PSIP — a program that brings first-year students, faculty and staff together to explore the city of Philadelphia in a day of service. The Saint Joseph's University community is privileged to have had such a passionate and dedicated teacher among us.

Catherine S. Murray Lifetime Service Award

MARIA S. MARSILIO, PHD

From her earliest days at Saint Joseph's University as a visiting faculty member in 1995–96, Maria S. Marsilio, PhD, professor and director of classical studies, has devoted herself to the growth and development of classics. In 10 years, she transformed a sporadic and fragmentary curriculum into one of the leading academic programs of the University. As a distinguished teacher and scholar, she inspired hundreds of students to undertake rigorous study and research in a discipline that had previously seemed remote and intimidating.

Her tireless devotion to the University mission was also apparent in her commitment to administration. For three years, she served as chair of the Department of Foreign Languages and subsequently became director of the Honors program, which she guided with exemplary skill and vision for eight more years. Her achievements in Honors reflected her passion for scholarly excellence and academic distinction. She initiated a mandatory research thesis that, for many students, became the defining experience of Honors education, and she introduced a first-year seminar program that acted as a vital gateway to the program for academically motivated first-year students.

The range of Marsilio's service — a member of APP and FPP, the Board of Rank and Tenure, the Faculty Review Board, the Institutional Planning Committee, and the College of Arts and Sciences Council — testify to her work ethic and institutional dedication. Throughout her entire career, she has demonstrated Jesuit principles in action, collaborating with administrators, colleagues and students in a spirit of humility, respect and fairness. In her character and accomplishments, she incarnates the spirit of *cura personalis*.

oday, Saint Joseph's is honored to recognize Brandon and Carlyne Graham, president and vice president of Team Graham, which provides mentorship and other community support to youth in the couple's hometown of Detroit, Michigan.

Brandon and Carlyne met in 2002 at Crockett Technical High School, where they established themselves early on as hardworking leaders with deep commitments to those in need. Carlyne put herself through her undergraduate studies at Lane College, a historically black college in Jackson, Tennessee, while simultaneously enlisting in the U.S. Army Reserve. She graduated with dual degrees in criminal justice and sociology in 2008, and pursued graduate degrees from Loyola University Chicago, earning a Master of Social Work and a law degree. Carlyne is currently an International Board of Lactation Consultant Examiners (IBCLC) candidate and working as a psychotherapist, helping mothers locally in the Philadelphia area who experience perinatal mood disorders. Her goal is to holistically support new mothers through the numerous trials of parenthood, including through postpartum depression and anxiety.

During his high school years, Brandon was named number one linebacker in the state and, as a junior, earned a full football scholarship to the University of Michigan, where he finished his college career ranked second in school history in sacks, tackles for loss and forced fumbles. In 2010, he was drafted by the Philadelphia Eagles in the 13th selection of the first round and was the first from the Big Ten Conference.

Brandon's NFL career requires no introduction. He has played his entire NFL career in Philadelphia, entering his 15th season as defensive end this year, which ties him for the most seasons played by an Eagle. Brandon helped lead the 2018 Eagles team to victory in Super Bowl LII, where he will forever be remembered for strip-sacking Tom Brady in the fourth quarter. He owns the fourth-most sacks in team history, ranks first on the franchise's all-time list with 195 career regular-season games played, and leads the Eagles with 44 sacks since 2017. In recognition of his leadership and generosity on and off the field, Brandon was recognized as the Eagles' 2022 Walter Payton NFL Man of the Year.

"My journey in Philadelphia over the past 13 years has been a humbling one. This city has embraced me and supported me throughout my career," said Brandon in a statement. "It's been a blessing to not only play in front of the best fans in the NFL, but to have the chance to give back to a community that has now become my home."

The Grahams married in 2014 and have two children together. Their foundation, Team Graham, mentors youth, provides clothes and food to families in need, and raises money for charities in the Detroit area. Team Graham's initiatives include Select 100, a summer program for high school students; an annual celebrity bowling fundraiser to raise money for Detroit organizations; and an annual backpack supply drive. One signature program, Carla's Circle, offers mentorship to young women and girls, focusing on empowerment, physical fitness and self motivation.

"With dedication and passion, we focus on the healthy development of women and young ladies' minds, body and souls," said Carlyne. "This circle promotes relationship growth and accountability, which you can use in all aspects of your life. Brandon and I believe in the gift of giving through service."

With great pride, the University honors Brandon and Carlyne Graham's extraordinary generosity of spirit by awarding them with Doctors of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*.

HAWK LEGACY AWARD

The Hawk Legacy Award is an award given to a student-athlete who best reflects the culture and values of Saint Joseph's Athletics through hard work and competitive excellence, selflessness, resilience, inclusion and service to others.

EXPLANATION OF ACADEMIC REGALIA

The first year in the academic life of Saint Joseph's College opened with a ceremony, the Mass of the Holy Spirit, and closed with a ceremony, a commencement exercise. In the years since, the academic year at Saint Joseph's has continued to open with a solemn Mass of the Holy Spirit and to close with a formal commencement. Thus firmly rooted in the history of Saint Joseph's, the ceremony in which you share today is part of a still older historical tradition, that of the medieval university, where as early as the 13th century, the awarding of academic degrees was attended with great ceremony and solemnity.

Today's academic procession replicates the march through the streets of Paris (or one of the other great university centers of the time) of the doctors and masters of the university, their somber gowns, brightened by the colored ornamentation of their hoods, testifying to their status as members of a corporate body, free of feudal controls, which alone possessed the right to fix the standards for academic degrees and licenses. Their gowns and hoods, practical garments designed to ward off the chill of unheated lecture halls and libraries and to provide adequate space to shelter books and manuscripts, provide the models for the gowns worn on ceremonial occasions by the professors and students of today.

The cut of the gown indicates the level of the degree. The bachelor's gown, always black in color, is cut simply, with long, pointed sleeves, and is worn closed. The traditional master's gown resembles the bachelor's except for the cut of the sleeves; these are quite long and cut above the elbow so that the lower part of the sleeve, closed at the bottom, hangs behind the wearer's arm or coat sleeve. Much more elaborate is the doctor's gown, embellished with velvet panels down the front and around the neck and with three velvet chevrons on each of its bell-shaped sleeves. The master's and doctor's gowns may be worn open or closed.

Hoods also vary in cut according to the degree represented: the bachelor's again being the most simple and doctor's the most elaborate. The hood is lined with silk in the colors of the university that granted the wearer's highest degree, and the color of the bordering velvet indicates the field of study to which the degree pertains.

THE SEAL OF SAINT JOSEPH'S UNIVERSITY

The first seal of Saint Joseph's College designed in 1852, the year of incorporation, featured a half-length figure of St. Joseph holding the Christ Child. The choice of this image for the first corporate seal reflects the founding of the college at St. Joseph's, the first Catholic church in Philadelphia, as well as the piety of Felix Joseph Barbelin, S.J., pastor of the church and founder of the college. This first seal was surrounded by one star for each state in the Union, a wreath of olive leaves and a bald eagle holding a banner inscribed *E Pluribus Unum* (Out of Many, One) at crest. The arms of the republic would have been important symbols for the new college to put forward, founded, as it was, at a time when the loyalty and patriotism of Catholics was questioned by Nativists.

By the turn of the century, the college had left the safety of the founding parish church, built a splendid new campus in North Philadelphia and developed a collegiate structure and identity. In 1903, John F. X. O'Conor, S.J., designed a new seal, more in keeping with the new collegiate identity. His design included most of the heraldic emblems, or charges, found in the modern shield of Saint Joseph's University.

The modern shield is quartered, that is, divided into four equal parts by a cross. In the upper left quarter, the dexter chief in heraldic terms, are 15 bands (bends): seven gold and eight red. The seven gold bands represent the seven sons of the House of Loyola: St. Ignatius and his six brothers. Red and gold are traditional as they are the heraldic colors of the royal House of Castille, to which the Loyola's were loyal.

In the upper right quarter, the sinister chief, is the coat of arms of the House of Loyola: two wolves at a kettle, said to symbolize the hospitality of the House. In the lower left quarter, the dexter base, is a lily, an iconographic attribute of St. Joseph, the patron of the University.

In the lower right quarter, the sinister base, is the emblem of the Society of Jesus. The letters "IHS" inscribed in a radiating sun at center are the Greek *iota*, *eta*, and *sigma*, the first three letters of the word "Jesus" in Greek. Rising out of the "H" is a cross, the symbol of redemption and salvation through Christianity. Below are three nails symbolizing the Passion of Christ.

The seal of the University is composed of the full heraldic shield with a periphery bearing the words "Saint Joseph's University Philadelphia 1851." The shield is used for institutional identification and ornamentation while the seal is used on diplomas, transcripts, and for the attestation of documents.
